



20 YEARS IN A BLINK

20 years of MINIs... 20 years of friends... 20 years of fun!

After 20 years we look back to 2003 where it all started....

In the year 2003, George W. Bush was the president of the United States and John Street the Mayor of Philadelphia. "In Da Club" by 50 Cent was the Billboard. End of the Year #1 Song, "Finding Nemo" the domestic, top grossing movie of 2003 and CSI: Crime Scene Investigation on CBS was the number 1 TV show. The LINC, Lincoln Financial Field, opened in 2003 and the Eagles ranked number 1 in the NFC East division.

A brand new MINI Cooper sold for \$18,575 MSRP in 2003. January 2003, The MINI Cooper and MINI Cooper S were selected as North American Car of the Year at the North American International Auto Show (NAIAS) press preview in Detroit.

Also in March 2003, the MINI One D (diesel) made it's world debut at the Geneva Auto Show and the John Cooper Works Tuning Kit debuted at the same show. In May of 2003, over 500 MINI fans in 250 MINI Coopers attended the preview screening of "The Italian Job" at Paramount Picture Studios lot in Los Angeles, CA. By June 2003 the 250,000th MINI was built in Oxford, England and delivered to a customer and the MINI One Diesel went on sale in the

United Kingdom. End of the year 2003 shows MINI with a sales increase of 22.4% over 2002.

The rainbow of MINI colors was not to be outdone in 2003 either. There were Jet Black, Chili Red, Liquid Yellow, Pepper White, and Velvet Red.

The Metallic colors were BRG, Cosmos Black, Dark Silver, Electric Blue, Indi Blue, Pure Silver and Solid Gold. Just this year, 2023, MINI decided to retire the ever popular Pepper White and replace it with the new bright, Nanuq White.

Just like MINI progressed over the past 20 years, so has Philly MINI. Lets take a look back to 2003 when it all began...

In an epic tale of love, for their MINIs, these founding members came together and gave life and spirit to the club we all know and love today!

On August 3, 2003, the very first PhillyMINI rally was held. Bucks County Covered Bridges was organized by Kim

LeMoon, Scott Laughlin, Craig and Jack and was 125 miles long. 64 cars (58 MINIs, 3 Classic Minis and 3 other cars showed up on a beautiful Bucks County day. They had people from as far away as Massachusetts (North) and Virginia (South) show up!

The rally started at White Rose Cafe' (now a Dunkin' Donuts) in Yardley and ended at Triumph Brewing Company in New Hope, PA.

Also that same month, PhillyMINI Meet, hosted by Julie Gross, toured the Philadelphia sights and landmarks with 37 MINIs. In October 2003 Tifanna and Peter organized the Fall Foliage and Lighthouse Rally with an option to ride the Lewes Delaware Ferry. The rally started at Deptford Mall, New Jersey and ended in Cape May.

Julie Gross, Stella Singleton and Harper Habbersett organized the Four Dogs Run which was 65 miles from Exton, PA to the Four Dogs Tavern in West Chester. To end the year, the very first Deck The MINIs was held December 6, 2003. Joan Logan, Julie Hoffman and Scott Laughlin organized a four-event holiday extravaganza. The events were: Winterthur Museum, Garden and Library (Wilmington, DE), followed by Simon Pearce Art Glass Studio, then on to Otto's MINI in West Chester and finally ending in Kennett Square, PA for Christmas at Longwood Gardens.

Some other note worthy mentions to this inaugural year of PhillyMINI, this was also the first running of MINIs on the Dragon in Fontana Dam, NC and MINIs on Top in New Hampshire. Also, the Philadelphia Inquirer ran a story about MINI Owners by Kellie Patrick.




